Public Reading of Scripture

John 1:35-51

The next day again John was standing with two of his disciples, and he looked at Jesus as he walked by and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following and said to them, "What are you seeking?" The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!" Nathanael said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathanael answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree,' do you believe? You will see greater things than these." And he said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."

Affirmation of the Faith

Orthodox Catechism 8 & 9

Q 24: How are these articles² divided?

A 24: Into three parts: God the Father and our creation; God the Son and our deliverance; God the Holy Spirit and our sanctification.

Q25: Since there is but one God,³ why do you speak of three: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

A25: Because that is how God has revealed himself in his Word: these three distinct persons are one, true, eternal God.⁴

Q26: What do you believe when you say, "I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth"?

A₂6: That the eternal Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who out of nothing created heaven and earth and everything in them,⁵ who still upholds and rules them by his eternal counsel and providence,⁶ is my God and Father because of Christ his Son.⁷

I trust him so much that I do not doubt he will provide whatever I need for body and soul,⁸ and he will turn to my good whatever adversity he sends me in this sad world.⁹

He is able to do this because he is almighty God; he desires to do this because he is a faithful Father.
