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## **Discussion Questions**

- 2. How do the actions of Shiphrah and Puah illustrate unwavering faithfulness and courage, even when faced with opposition, and what can we learn from their story about the impact such steadfastness can have on shaping future generations and narratives?
- 3. How does the apparent breaking and eventual keeping of God's promises, as seen in the story of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, provide a perspective on understanding challenging times when it appears that God is not keeping His promises to us?
