The Athanasian Creed ( $6^{th}$  Century), Part II<sup>1</sup>

The Father was neither made nor created nor begotten from anyone.

The Son was neither made nor created;

he was begotten from the Father alone.

The Holy Spirit was neither made nor created nor begotten; he proceeds from the Father and the Son.

Accordingly there is one Father, not three fathers; there is one Son, not three sons; there is one Holy Spirit, not three holy spirits.

Nothing in this trinity is before or after, **nothing is greater or smaller;** in their entirety the three persons are coeternal and coequal with each other.

So in everything, as was said earlier, we must worship their trinity in their unity and their unity in their trinity.

Anyone then who desires to be saved should think thus about the Trinity.

## Confession & Promise of Grace

Ephesians 2:4-7 (ESV)

But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— and raised us up with him and

seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The Athanasian Creed takes its name for the chief defender of biblical orthodoxy on the incarnation during the 300s, Athanasius of Alexandria, a "mere" deacon. This confession summarizes dense and various explicit and implicit truths of Scripture. A reference guide can be made available to interested parties, but the prooftexts are much later additions from the 21<sup>st</sup> century.
