"Don't Miss the Finger of God": The First Three Plagues Zach Carter Exodus 7:14–8:19

- 1. We have a knowledge problem and ask "Who is the Lord that I should obey his voice"?
- 2. Every one of us will eventually know that the Lord is God.
- 3. Our unwillingness to see clear evidence that the Lord is God causes us to harden our hearts.

Affirmation of the Faith

Orthodox Catechism (1680) Lesson 25

Q 65: It is by faith alone that we share in Christ and all his blessings: where then does that faith come from?

A: The Holy Spirit produces it in our hearts¹ by the preaching of the holy gospel,² and confirms it through our use of the holy sacraments.³

⁴ In the 1600s, the Reformed, Presbyterian, Congregationalist, and Baptist ilk used the words "ordinance" and "sacrament" interchangeably. 1800s Baptists and Restorationists in America have opted for "ordinance" to strip away even sniffs of Roman theology. *Sacrament* is preferred, however, because it links the sign/seal, symbol, and Word to confirm grace. Baptism and the

A: Sacraments are holy signs and seals for us to see. They were instituted by God so that by our use of them he might make us understand more clearly the promise of the gospel, and might put his seal on that promise.⁵ And this is God's gospel promise: to forgive our sins and give us eternal life by grace alone because of Christ's one sacrifice finished on the cross.⁶

Q 67: Are both the word and the sacraments then intended to focus our faith on the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross as the only ground of our salvation?

A: Right! In the gospel the Holy Spirit teaches us and through the holy sacraments he assures us that our entire salvation rests on Christ's one sacrifice for us on the cross.⁷

Q 68: How many sacraments did Christ institute in the New Testament? *A:* **Two: baptism and the Lord's Supper.**⁸

Lord's Supper are more than mere commemoration. They actively testify to grace. Still, there is freedom in Christ: Redeemer's adopted statement of faith from 1830s America says "ordinance" reflecting the interchangeability of these terms in days past.
