Scripture Reading John 8:48–59 (ESV)

Before Abraham Was, I Am

⁴⁸ The Jews answered him, “Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?” ⁴⁹ Jesus answered, “I do not have a demon, but I honor my Father, and you dishonor me. ⁵⁰ Yet I do not



seek my own glory; there is One who seeks it, and he is the judge.

⁵¹ Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death.” ⁵² The Jews said to him, “Now we know that you have a demon! Abraham died, as did the prophets, yet you say, ‘If anyone keeps my word, he will never taste death.’” ⁵³ Are you greater than our father Abraham, who died? And the prophets died! Who do you make yourself out to be?” ⁵⁴ Jesus answered, “If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father who glorifies me, of whom you say, ‘He is our God.’” ⁵⁵ But you have not known him. I know him. If I were to say that I do not know him, I would be a liar like you, but I do know him and I keep his word. ⁵⁶ Your father Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day. He saw it and was glad.” ⁵⁷ So the Jews said to him, “You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?” ⁵⁸ Jesus said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am.” ⁵⁹ So they picked up stones to throw at him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple.

Affirmation of the Faith

Orthodox Catechism (1680) Lesson 35

Q 98: What is the Law of God?

A: The Decalogue [dec·a·log], or the Ten Commandments.¹

Q 99: How are these commandments divided?

A: Into two tables. The first has four commandments, teaching us what our relation to God should be. The second has six commandments, teaching us what we owe our neighbor.²

Q 100: What is the Preface to the ten Commandments?

A: I am JEHOVAH,³ the Lord your God, who brought you out of the Land of Egypt, out of the House of Bondage.

³ Jehovah’s Witnesses falsely accuse Orthodox Christians of changing the name (and thus identity) of God from Jehovah to Yahweh. In Latin and German, a voiced palatal approximant (*yod*) takes the “I/J.” (Think *jaeger schnitzel*). English, however, shows the



Q 101: What do we learn from the Preface?

A: Three things: first he shows to whom the right of all Rule belongs, that is, to God himself for he says, “I am JEHOVAH.”

Secondly, he says he is the God of his people, that through the promise of his bountifulness he might encourage them to obey him.

Thirdly, he says, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, as if he should say, I am the one who made myself known to you and bestowed all those Blessings upon you; therefore you art bound to show thankfulness and obedience unto me.⁴

Q 102: Do these things belong to us?

A: Yes, because they figuratively include and imply all the deliverances of the Church; and further, also this was a type of our wonderful Deliverance achieved by Christ.

Confession and Promise of Grace

Colossians 2:13–15 (ESV)

¹³ And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵ He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.
