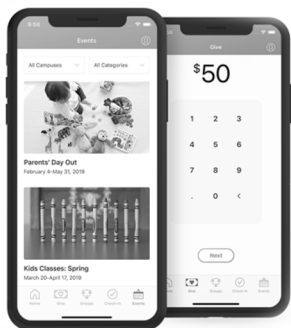

Sermon

“Clothed in Righteousness”

Exodus 27:9-29:9



Scripture Reading

John 11:17-27

I Am the Resurrection and the Life

¹⁷ Now when Jesus came, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb four days. ¹⁸ Bethany was near Jerusalem, about two miles off, ¹⁹ and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to console them concerning their brother. ²⁰ So when Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met him, but Mary remained seated in the house. ²¹ Martha said to Jesus, “Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. ²² But even now I know that whatever you ask from God, God will give you.” ²³ Jesus said to her, “Your brother will rise again.” ²⁴ Martha said to him, “I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day.” ²⁵ Jesus said to her, “I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, ²⁶ and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?” ²⁷ She said to him, “Yes, Lord; I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who is coming into the world.”

Affirmation of the Faith

Orthodox Catechism (1680), Lesson 19

Q 50: Why the next words: "and is seated at the right hand of God"?

A: Christ ascended to heaven, there to show that he is head of his church,¹ and that the Father rules all things through him.²

Q 51: How does this glory of Christ our head benefit us?

A: First, through his Holy Spirit he pours out his gifts from heaven upon us his members.³ Second, by his power he defends us and keeps us safe from all enemies.⁴

Q 52: How does Christ's return "to judge the living and the dead" comfort you?

A: In all my distress and persecution I turn my eyes to the heavens and confidently await as judge the very One who has already stood trial in my place before God and so has removed the whole curse from me.⁵

All his enemies and mine he will condemn to everlasting punishment: but me and all his chosen ones he will take along with him into the joy and the glory of heaven.⁶

Confession and Promise of Grace

Ephesians 2:19–22

¹⁹So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, ²⁰built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, ²¹in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord.

²²In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit.
