Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, by this time there will be an odor, for he has been dead four days." ⁴⁰ Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed you would see the glory of God?" ⁴¹ So they took away the stone. And Jesus lifted up his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. ⁴² I knew that you always hear me, but I said this on account of the people standing around, that they may believe that you sent me." ⁴³ When he had said these things, he cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out." ⁴⁴ The man who had died came out, his hands and feet bound with linen strips, and his face wrapped with a cloth. Affirmation of the Faith

Orthodox Catechism (1680), Lesson 19

Q 53: What do you believe concerning "the Holy Spirit"?

A: First, he, as well as the Father and the Son, is eternal God.¹ Second, he has been given to me personally,² so that, by true faith, he makes me

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share in Christ and all his blessings, $^{\scriptscriptstyle 3}$ comforts me, $^{\scriptscriptstyle 4}$ and remains with me forever. $^{\scriptscriptstyle 5}$

Q54: What do you believe concerning "the holy catholic church"?

A: I believe that the Son of God through his Spirit and Word,⁶ out of the entire human race,⁷ from the beginning of the world to its end,⁸ gathers, protects, and preserves for himself a community chosen for eternal life⁹ and united in true faith.¹⁰ And of this community I am¹¹ and always will be¹² a living member.

Q55: What do you understand by "the communion of saints"?

A: First, that believers one and all, as members of this community, share in Christ and in all his treasures and gifts.¹³ Second, that each member should consider it a duty to use these gifts readily and cheerfully for the service and enrichment of the other members.¹⁴

Q56: What do you believe concerning "the forgiveness of sins"?

A: I believe that God, because of Christ's atonement, will never hold against me any of my sins¹⁵ nor my sinful nature which I need to struggle against all my life.¹⁶ Rather, in his grace God grants me the righteousness of Christ to free me forever from judgment.¹⁷
