

Christ is mine forevermore


Come rejoice now O my soul For His love is my reward Fear is gone and hope is sure Christ is mine forevermore

Sermon

Zach Carter "Faithfulness in Worship and Life" Exodus 34:10-35

- 1. We are consistently pulled back towards compromised worship (10-17).
- 2. So, we must resist compromise and obey God's commands (18-26).
- 3. However, in our nature we love compromise and fear the refining light of God's glory (27-30).
- 4. We have a mediator, Jesus Christ, who loves the light of God's glory and speaks God's words (31-35; cf., 2 Cor. 3:7-18).
- 5. We can indeed be transformed ourselves by Christ's Word and work in our everyday lives.

John 12:27-43


The Son of Man Must Be Lifted Up

²⁷"Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour. ²⁸ Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." ²⁹ The crowd that stood there and heard it said that it had thundered. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." ³⁰ Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not mine. ³¹ Now is the judgment of this world; now will the ruler of this world be cast out. ³² And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." ³³ He said this to show by what kind of death he was going to die. ³⁴ So the crowd answered him, "We have heard from the Law that the Christ remains forever. How can you say that the Son of Man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of Man?" ³⁵ So Jesus said to them, "The light is among you for a little while longer. Walk while you have the light, lest darkness overtake you. The one who walks in the darkness does not know where he is going. ³⁶ While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light."

The Unbelief of the People

When Jesus had said these things, he departed and hid himself from them. ³⁷ Though he had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in him, ³⁸ so that the word spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

"Lord, who has believed what he heard from us.



³⁹ Therefore they could not believe. For again Isaiah said,

"He has blinded their eyes and hardened their heart, lest they see with their eyes, and understand with their heart, and turn, and I would heal them."

Affirmation of the Faith

Orthodox Catechism (1680)

Q 62: Why can't the good we do make us right with God, or at least help make us right with him?

A: Because the righteousness which can pass God's scrutiny must be entirely perfect and must in every way measure up to the divine law.¹ Even the very best we do in this life is imperfect and stained with sin.²

Q 63: How can you say that the good we do doesn't earn anything when God promises to reward it in this life and the next?³

A: God's perfect righteousness is not earned; it is a gift of grace.4

Q64: But doesn't this teaching make people indifferent and wicked?

A: No. It is impossible for those grafted into Christ by true faith not to produce fruits of gratitude.⁵

As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²² And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld."
