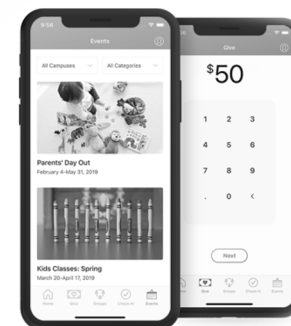
Stay Connected in 2025

“A Place for His Presence”

Exodus 40

1. Preparing for God’s presence (1-33)
2. Glory of God’s presence (34-35)
3. Following God’s presence (36-38)



ask Jesus of whom he was speaking. ²⁵ So that disciple, leaning back against Jesus, said to him, “Lord, who is it?” ²⁶ Jesus answered, “It is he to whom I will give this morsel of bread when I have dipped it.” So when he had dipped the morsel, he gave it to Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot. ²⁷ Then after he had taken the morsel, Satan entered into him. Jesus said to him, “What you are going to do, do quickly.” ²⁸ Now no one at the table knew why he said this to him. ²⁹ Some thought that, because Judas had the moneybag, Jesus was telling him, “Buy what we need for the feast,” or that he should give something to the poor. ³⁰ So, after receiving the morsel of bread, he immediately went out. And it was night.

A New Commandment

³¹ When he had gone out, Jesus said, “Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him. ³² If God is glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself, and glorify him at once. ³³ Little children, yet a little while I am with you. You will seek me, and just as I said to the Jews, so now I also say to you, ‘Where I am going you cannot come.’ ³⁴ A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. ³⁵ By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”

Affirmation of the Faith

Orthodox Catechism (1680)

Q 69: What is baptism?

A: Immersion or dipping of the person in water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, by such who are duly qualified by Christ.¹

Q 70: Who are the proper subjects of this ordinance?

A: Those who actually profess credible repentance towards God, faith in, and obedience to our Lord Jesus Christ.²

Q 71: Should infants, too, be baptized?

Answer: No, for we have neither precept nor example for that practice in all the Book of God.

Q 72: Does the Scriptures forbid the Baptism of Infants?

A: It is sufficient that the Holy Scriptures commands the baptizing of believers, unless we will make ourselves wiser than what is written.

Confession and Promise of Grace

¹ John 4:15–21

¹⁵ Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. ¹⁶ So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him.

¹⁷ By this is love perfected with us, so that we may have confidence for the day of judgment, because as he is so also are we in this world. ¹⁸ There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love. ¹⁹ We love because he first loved us. ²⁰ If anyone says, “I love God,” and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen.

²¹ And this commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother.
