

Scripture Reading

John 21:1-14

Jesus Appears to Seven Disciples

21 After this Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and he revealed himself in this way. ² Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples were together. ³ Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

⁴ Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. ⁵ Jesus said to them, "Children, do you have any fish?" They answered him, "No." ⁶ He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, because of the quantity of fish. ⁷ That disciple whom Jesus loved therefore said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work, and threw himself into the sea. ⁸ The other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off.

⁹When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire in place, with fish laid out on it, and bread. ¹⁰Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." ¹¹So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, 153 of them. And although there were so many, the net was not torn. ¹²Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. ¹³Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. ¹⁴This was now the

third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

Affirmation of Faith

Orthodox Catechism (1680 modernized)

Q119: What is the sixth Commandment?

A: You shall not murder.1

Q120: What is God's will for you in the sixth commandment?

A: I must not belittle, insult, hate, or kill my neighbor — not in my thoughts, my words, my facial expressions or gestures, and certainly not in my actions. I must not encourage or join in when others do these things. 2

Instead, I must put away all desire for revenge.³ I must not harm or carelessly endanger myself.⁴

God has also given the government the authority to protect life and punish wrongdoing.⁵

Q. 121. Does this commandment refer only to killing?

A. No. By forbidding murder, God teaches us that He hates the root of murder: envy, hatred, anger, and the desire to get even. In God's eyes, these attitudes are a form of murder.

Q. 122. Is it enough, then, that we do not kill our neighbor?

A. No. By condemning envy, hatred, and anger, God calls us to love our neighbors as ourselves 8 —to be patient, peaceable, gentle, merciful,

and friendly toward them;⁹ to protect them from harm whenever we can; and to do good even to our enemies.¹⁰

Confession and Assurance of Pardon

Romans 5:8-10

⁸ but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. ⁹ Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. ¹⁰ For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life.
